Lama Padma Yontan Gyatso (Richard Baldwin) began his formal Buddhist training in India in 1970 with the outstanding meditation master, Venerable Kalu Rinpoche I. Returning to the U.S., he entered the Buddhist Studies Program at the University of Washington. At that time, he also received many teachings from Venerable Dezhung Rinpoche, a master of all lineages. In 1982 he became a student of H.E. Chagdud Tulku Rinpoche.
